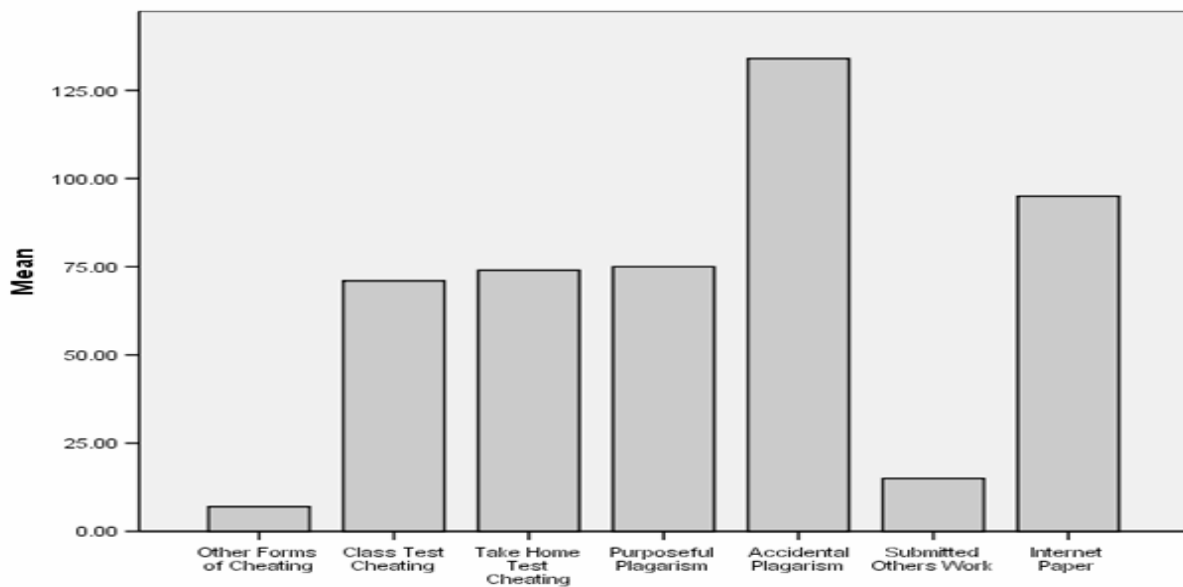

- \_\_\_\_ The use of another's ideas without citation
- \_\_\_\_ Material copied word for word, cited but lacking quotation marks
- \_\_\_\_ Material placed within quotation marks but lacking a citation (according to the professor's preferred citation style)
- \_\_\_\_ Paraphrased material that too closely resembles the structure of the original source, without citation or attribution
- \_\_\_\_ Paraphrased material from several sources pieced together in a way that resembles original thought, without citation or attribution
- \_\_\_\_ Material attributed to a non-existent or incorrect source
- \_\_\_\_ Fabricated material attributed to a real source
- \_\_\_\_ Citation mistakes, such as wrong author, page number, or date
- \_\_\_\_ Specific help from someone in writing the paper, without acknowledgment
- \_\_\_\_ Imitation of structure or style, without citation or attribution

5. \_\_\_\_ Students should not assume that they can work on and complete assignments together.
6. \_\_\_\_ When a native speaker proofreads my writing tasks for grammar, that is plagiarism.
7. \_\_\_\_ Georgetown University has an official plagiarism policy in place.
8. \_\_\_\_ Georgetown has several standards of conduct.
9. \_\_\_\_ Another expression for cheating is "academic deception."
10. \_\_\_\_ In all academic disciplines, sources (or ideas of others) are attributed (documented) in the same format.
11. \_\_\_\_ Students can submit papers written at other schools in their Georgetown classes.
12. \_\_\_\_ If a student has been found to have plagiarized on a paper, he/she can be dismissed from the university.
13. \_\_\_\_ If a student has been found to have plagiarized on a paper, he/she does not have to worry about that information appearing on his/her academic transcript.
14. \_\_\_\_ Most accusations of academic honesty violations at GU were against business school students.
15. \_\_\_\_ Most academic violations were plagiarism, the second most were collaboration that had not been approved by the professor, and the third most violations were cheating.
16. \_\_\_\_ In many countries, using someone else's work and words is a sign of respect, but in the US it is not.
